Minute for Mission: Today, Heather Franklin from Buckhead Christian Ministries visits us to share about BCM and an amazing event Northwest is hosting after worship on April 13!

Sunday, April 13, 12:30 to 3pm: Join us at for an interactive experience to explore the impact of poverty. An optional lunch will be served at noon. The Cost of Poverty Experience (COPE) is a 2.5 hour simulation that explores the lived experience of poverty firsthand through the eyes of real families. The experiential nature of this training helps organizations and communities more deeply understand the human and systemic impacts of poverty.

For years, many top down or well-intentioned approaches to poverty have left out the wisdom and leadership of those closest to the challenges. Created with the input of individuals with personal experience in poverty, COPE sheds light on these challenges and catalyzes meaningful dialogue and action. This experience challenges participants to rethink poverty, respond effectively, and partner with those affected for change.
